
About the course

The upper limb trauma course is now in its 8th year and has been continuously improved in line with feedback from previous courses.

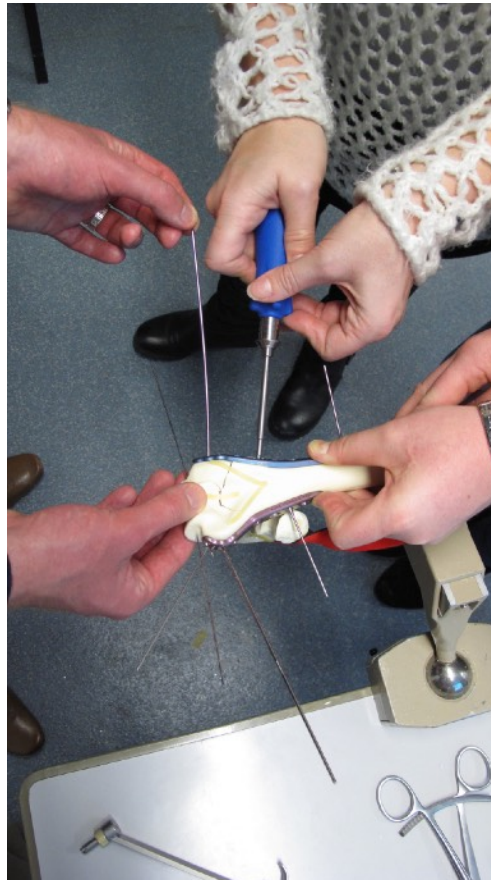
This course is aimed at theatre staff who regularly perform fracture surgery, are new to the discipline or who occasionally perform emergency fracture surgery as well as therapists who rehabilitate patients after upper limb trauma surgery. It is also appropriate for staff undertaking elective orthopaedic surgery as the principles are transferable. The practical style of the lectures gives a great insight into the reasons for performing the procedures whilst the hands-on workshops give an appreciation of the techniques and familiarity with the instrumentation. Whilst we use the Acumed systems for the workshops, the principles are widely applicable to all internal fixation systems.

The course faculty is a mix of theatre staff, advanced nurse practitioners, and surgical staff to bring a holistic, multidisciplinary approach to the subject. The course is aimed squarely at delivering the principles behind the various techniques of internal fixation using the workshops to reinforce this giving confidence and understanding to those involved in surgery as well as those involved in postoperative therapy.

Contents

A mix of practical sessions and lectures including:

- Principles of internal fixation
- Shoulder girdle fractures and dislocations
- Dislocations and fractures around the distal humerus and elbow
- Forearm and wrist injuries
- Participants will perform surgical fracture fixations on bone models
